Military Science is an advanced, applied-leadership class that uses military structure to allow for maximum opportunity for leadership and management experience.

CLASS EXPECTATIONS:

- **Student must have a current sports physical on record.** Students will engage in physical training twice a week. The level of exercise in this class will surpass what is usually seen in traditional PE classes.
- **Student will wear a cadet Uniform** (provided to them) every Wednesday. Uniform must be clean, ironed, well maintained, and worn in accordance to regulation.

 - How to collaborate/duet with other guitarists

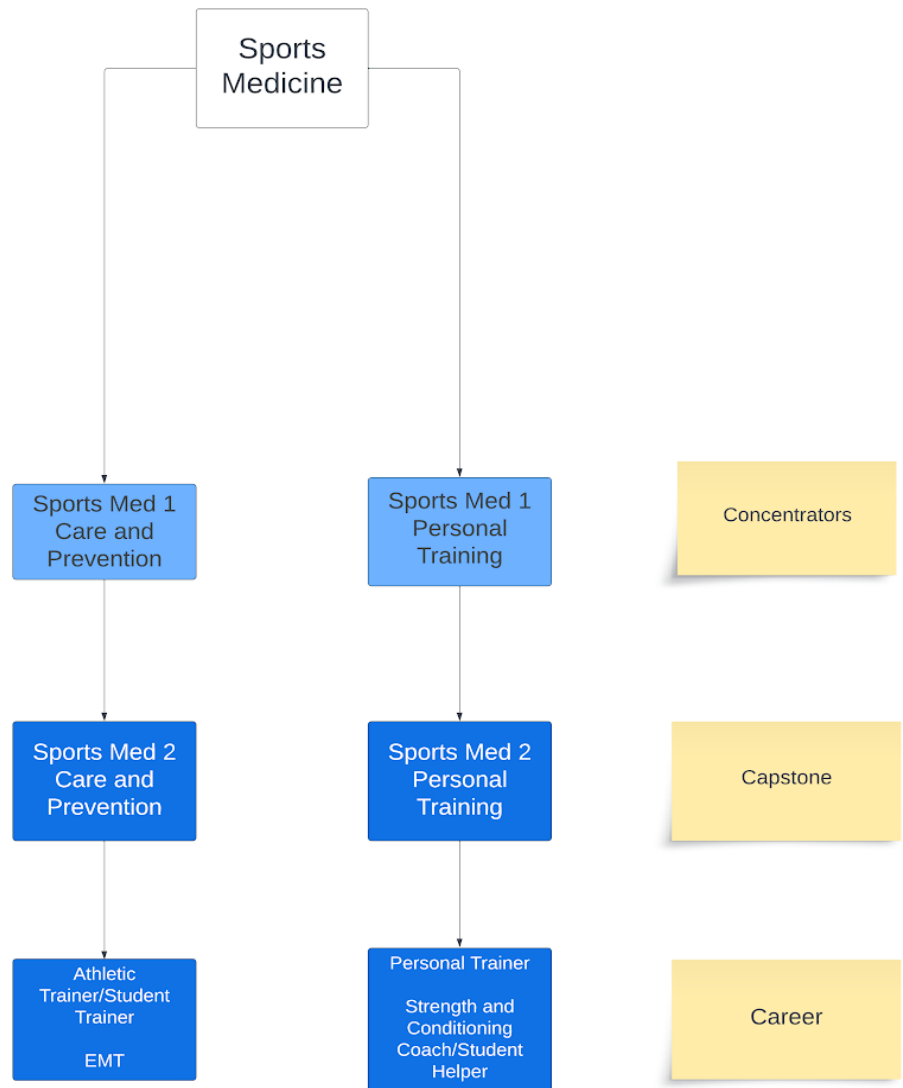
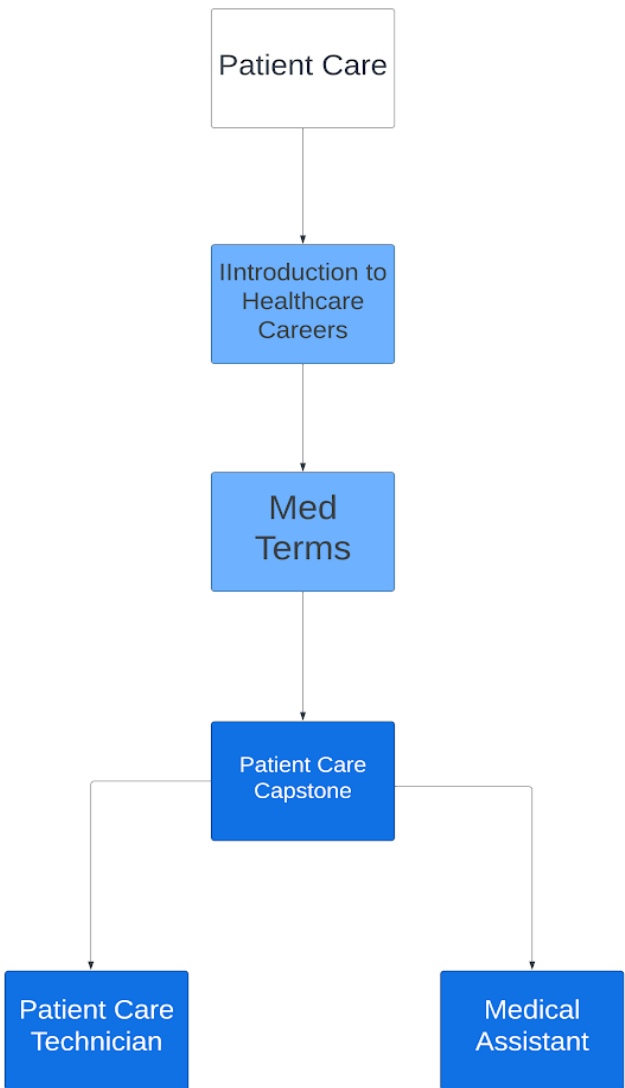
Most Students are in our program 4 years!


